## City Sells Shrubs, Evergreens— Inexpensive For Arbor Week

FARMINGTON selling over 700 trees to residents.

THIS YEAR, the committee organized a program to allow Farmington residents to purchase shrubs and evergreens instead to enable residents to further beautify their landscape at a savings.

Two flowering shrubs available at \$2.95 each, including tax, are:

Red Twig Dogwood, which has colorful red twigs and creamy white flowers followed by white berries to provide color across the year around, is from two to two and a half feet tall when purchased and grows to six to eight feet:

Lynwood Gold Forsythia, which has golden flowers in spring before foliage appears, can be cut for flowering in the house during winter months, is from three to four feet when purchased and grows to five to eight feet tall.

EVERGREENS available at \$3.95 each including tax are:

Hetz Juniper, which is shrub-like and has rapid growth, is purchased at one and a half to two feet tall and grows to five feet tall with spread of five feet or more;

Dwarf Yew, a slow growing evergreen with low, irregular and picturesque outline making it excellent for specimen, hedge or edging, is from one to one and a half feet tall when purchased and grows to three feet tall.

All the shrubs and evergreens are guaranteed for six months. Each is potted in a self-dissolving container which simplifies planting.

RESIDENTS should present the coupon printed below to the Steinke Nursery, 28915 Farmington Rd., during April 23-29, to purchase unlimited quantities of any or all of the above mentioned shrubs and

evergreens at Arbor Week savings.

The city council issued a proclamation declaring April 23 as Arbor Week and April 26 as Arbor Day in Farmington.

Arbor Day will be observed by the city having a tree planting ceremony on city property.

Arbor Day is designated by law in each state of the U.S. and in foreign countries as a time for reflection about trees and their contribution to health and happiness.

The specific day for Arbor Day was conceived and named by J. Sterling Morton in 1872, a member of the State Board of Agriculture of Nebraska.

Earlier, the day was observed by students planting trees or seedlings on school property but has since grown to involve the community with adult planting trees to improve residential landscapes.

## April Is Month To Clean The Air

An appeal is being made to Farmington residents to do their part to help clean up the air during the month of April.

April has been declared National Emissions Control Month by President Nixon and proclaimed that locally by the Farmington City Council.

EMISSIONS can be a dirty word when faulty vehicles result in black smoke coming out of tail pipes.

Gordon Zemnickas, manager of Astro Tune-Up of Farmington, would like to eliminate most of this black air and keep the air as clean as possible during April.

As a special feature during Emissions Control Month, Zemnickas is offering a comprehensive emissions control analysis at half price, \$4.95 instead of the regular charge of \$9.95.

The analysis checks out the ignition, emissions control and fuel systems of the vehicle and locates which of the systems are responsible for emitting black smoke.

Residents wanting to check their vehicle emissions during April can locate the Farmington Astro Tune-Up at 3169 Grand River, two blocks west of Orchard Lake.

The purpose of this analysis is to spot cars with excessive exhaust emissions," he concludes, "and other faults and recommend corrections to the owners of the offending cars."


