THRIVE ON PROTEIN FEEDS

Little pigs thrive and make excellent grains on high protein feed instruces, says W. N. McMillen, excellent grains on high protein feed instruces, says W. N. McMillen, exception animal husbandry specialist at Michigan State college.

- MSC lests have shown that "stunting" of little pigs may be caused by ration too low in protein. To find out how protein affected pigs gaining weight, McMillen, worked with Dr. R.-W. Luceke, agricultural research chemist and Dr. Frank Thorpe, Jr., research veterinarian, to conduct feeding tests.

Weanling, pigs, six weeks old, were fed different amounts of protein and weight of the pigs of th

McMillen points out that farmers

FROZEN CUSTARD PROVES POPULAR IN MICHIGAN

The ice cream industry of Michigan is rapidly expanding to its pre-war status. The number of licensed dealers in the state has increased from 632 on March 1, 1947 to 655 at the present date, and will probably reach 700 before the will probably reach 700 before the end of the year. During the war many ice cream manufacturers dis-continued due to curtailment in the use of dairy products and sugar. The number of manufacturers de-creased from \$17 in 1941 to 603 in

The number of manufacturers of recreased from \$1.7 in 1911 to 602 in 1945. Several of these establishments have re-opened and may entirely new plants have already opened or are under construction, according to F. W. Skiver, Chief of the Bureau of Dalrying.

Frozen Custard is one of the types of ice cream that is attracting considerable attention. Years ago this type of lee cream was made with plenty of eggs, was frozen in the old hand freezer. Many of the new plants are dispensing custard ice cream direct to the consumer from the new type fast freezing machines.
