V. A. AIDS TO HARD-OF-HEARING

The Veterans Administration estimated that some 30,000 World War II veterans with service-connected hearing impairments may be eligible for its recently established rehabilitation program.

The program will be available to all eligible hard-of-hearing veterans, whether they require medical attention to improve their hearing or whether they are in need of rehabilitation because of some permanent impairment.

Two Veterans Administration hospitals and two Naval hospitals have been designated as centers where reconstruction operations may be performed on those veterans who stand a chance of regaining some degree of hearing acuity through treatment.
