List Sales For Graded Feeder Cattle

Michigan cattle feeders will have an opportunity to buy graded feeder cattle at two cooperative sales which will be held in northern Michigan during October. Graydon Blank, extension animal husbandry specialist at Michigan State college, announced this week.

The specialist points out that feeders will want to take advantage of the opportunity to buy native graded feeder cattle. They are adjusted to the climate, there is less danger from losses due to shipping fever, and they start on feed readily.

Approximately 500 head of these cattle will be offered at the second annual sale of the Northern Michigan Beef Breeders' Association, which will be held at Gaylord on October 2. The offering will consist of Herefords, Angus and Short-horns, with Herefords predominating. The bulk of the offering will be steer and heifer calves, weighing around 400 pounds. However, some yearling steers and heifers and a few bred heifers will be included.

At least 700 head, all Herefords, will be sold at West Branch on October 16 by the Northeastern Michigan Hereford Calf Association. The bulk of the offering will also be heifer and steer calves.

The cattle at both sales will be sold in uniform lots of from six to 12 head. A few choice calves will be sold individually and should make good 4H club steer, according to Blank.

Mechanization of Wheat
Mechanization of wheat farming developed rapidly in the United States between 1920 and 1930. According to official figures, the number of combined harvester-dresser machines on farms increased during that decade from 4,000 to 61,000, the number of tractors rose from 246,000 to 920,000 and motor trucks increased from 120,000 to 900,000. This mechanization of wheat farming increased output of human labor by 100 per cent.

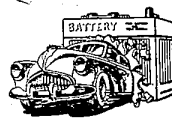

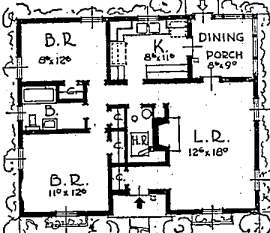
