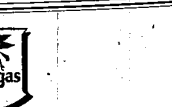

plut after plut of blood to the war
effort."

Erdmann said that donors at the
clinic here will spend less than one-
half hour at the clinic and will suf-
fer no pain nor harmful after-
effects.

REGISTER NOW
Clubs and organizations can make
group registrations for the clinic.
The registrations can be made by
telephoning Farmington 0025 or
0707. In all cases, the chairman
said, the local workers will notify
the donor of the appointment time
and will give any further informa-
tion necessary.

Nonmedical and nontechnical per-
sonnel at the clinic will be provid-
ed. Clinic sessions are to be held
from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. and from
5:00 to 7:00 p.m. Monday, October
28, and from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. and
from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday,
October 21. After the blood is tak-
en, donors are served appropriate
food by Red Cross volunteers.

To be acceptable as a registrant,
Erdmann explained, donors must
weigh at least 115 pounds and must
have no acute illnesses nor histor-
ies of recent serious illnesses or
operations. Only those who can
safely give a pint of blood are ac-
cepted by the physicians and nurses
attached to the mobile blood serv-
ice unit which handles the collections
of blood.

As many as 120 donors a day can
be handled by the facilities of the
mobile unit of the Michigan De-
partment of Health which will visit
here.
