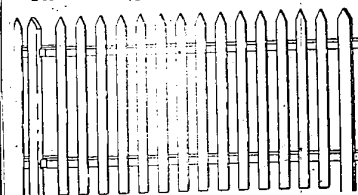

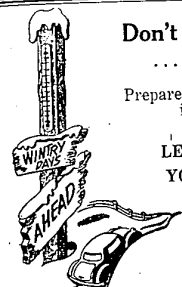

Conservation Officers
Check Pheasants

Southern Michigan hunters may see many unfamiliar faces among men in conservation officers' uniforms in the brief pheasant season, with established law enforcement staffs now strongly reinforced with upstate and free lance officers.

It has been learned that 40 "rookie" officers newly trained in reconnaissance are now in the southern counties, but Durward Robson, chief of the conservation department's field administration division, has declined to reveal how many experienced men from the north have been brought down to stiffen pheasant law enforcement.

Conservation officers that hunters will meet at road intersections and in the fields will be checking especially close this season on the killing of hen pheasants. The hens are urgently needed for rebuilding the state's low pheasant stocks next season.

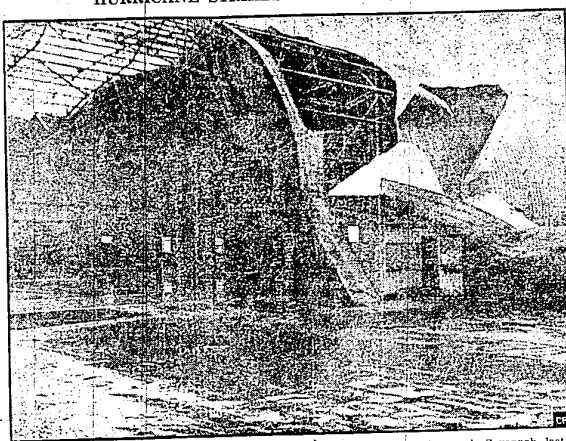

EDISON COMPANY HOPES TO RESUME NORMAL PROGRAM

When materials are once more available, The Detroit Edison Company will resume normal construction work on street lighting installations for the first time since 1941, officials of the Company announce.

During the war years, Edison completely exhausted its reserve supply of street lighting equipment in repair and replacement work. In 1944 a survey was conducted to determine the street lighting needs of the 215 cities and towns in the Edison's Southeastern Michigan area.

As a result of the findings, many of the communities ordered additional equipment, but the material shortage kept their orders unfilled. Now the utility concern has back orders for 2,700 overhead lights and 900 ornamental street lamps on its books. As standards, luminaires and accessories are received, they will be installed as quickly as possible.

After several years of waiting, the Company is hoping that enough materials will be received soon so that a full size program, halted since 1941, can be resumed.

Pine Seedling Supply Is Assured

Halfway through the season for supplying pine seedlings and transplanting for fall reforestation planting, the conservation department has orders for 290,000 trees on its books.

Shipping from the Higgins Lake nursery is to continue into November. No white pine stock is available this fall, but farmers and others planning fall plantings are assured up to 1,500 red pines each, and unlimited supplies of jack pine.
