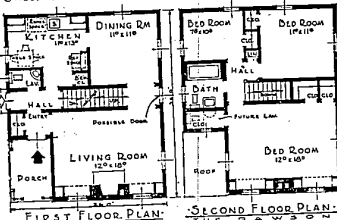

**THE DAWSON** — White clapboard in combination with red brick has for long been a favorite device of architects to achieve style; the two story, six room house has for long been the favorite of home builders. In the Dawson, these two old time favorites have been combined in a design that leaves little room for improvement. The perfectly square house has the least amount of walls and roof per square foot of floor area and therefore costs less than do rambling plans. The Dawson, 28 feet by 30 feet, manages to approximate the perfect square and yet retains its pleasing lines. It has nothing of the top heavy, boxy appearance that characterizes so many small, cubical approximately 18,000 feet. The Dawson has been so designed that on almost any lot some living room windows may face the south in winter sun. It has the added advantage of fitting on a narrow lot. The room arrangement is ideal. Either "front" entrance leads into a hallway with a splendid coat closet. The large living room features an open fireplace. There is both a real dining room and eating space in the kitchen. A luxury is the downstairs lavatory. Large bedrooms, plenty of closets and room space for an extra lavatory are highspots of the second floor. ## Aviation Cadet Exams Are Being Given Now

A mobile caravan equipped to give qualifying examinations to aviation cadet applicants will be at Seidreid Field from the 20th to the 31st of October, announced Colonel Walter C. Cole, Commanding Officer of the Michigan Recruiting District.

Applicants must be unmarried, male citizens of the United States, between 20 and 26½ years of age, and must have at least two years of college education or be able to pass an equivalent examination.

Qualified applicants will be assigned to the 1 March 1948 Aviation Cadet Training Class at Randolph Field, Texas. Upon successful completion of training, cadets are rated as pilots and commissioned as Second Lieutenants, United States Air Force Reserve.

## New Pictures Will Show Rebuilding

Cities, farms, industries and rebuilding of war damage in post-war Poland and Italy will be pictured in new motion pictures, filmed by himself this last winter, by Helen Bryan, foreign correspondent and author of "Steps" for the World Adventure Series at the Detroit Institute of Arts this coming week end.

"Inside Poland — 1947" will be Bryan's motion picture subject at 8:30, next Saturday evening, October 25, and again at 5:30 Sunday evening, October 26. His new pictures show Warsaw, Krakow, Gdynia, the newly acquired seaport of Danzig, Zakopane and other cities; farms, industries and mines; living conditions in post-war Poland.

At 3:30 next Sunday afternoon, October 26, Bryan will speak on "Inside Italy — 1947". His new motion pictures take the audience to Rome, Florence, Siena, Pisa; other cities; to the famous region near Capri at harvest time; to factories and to Italian homes.

## INSPIRED BY FATHER

## HIGH DENTAL DECAY RATE IS REPORTED

"Caries (decay) is attacking the teeth of one out of every two and three-year-old children in Michigan. The average five-year-old in the state has five cavities in his teeth, and one out of every three five-year-olds has a primary tooth which needs extracting. In one Michigan city 85 per cent of school children had caries in their permanent teeth. Approximately 95 per cent of the state's population have dental disease."

These facts, established by surveys of the Michigan Department of Health, were revealed today by Dr. Fred Wertheimer, Director of the Bureau of Public Health Industry, pointing out the need for earlier dental care and more widespread dental health education in the state.

One authority has indicated that if tooth decay were a malignant disease terminating in death, almost the entire population of the state would be wiped out in a generation.

Dental caries is a bacterial disease, just as is tuberculosis or smallpox, except it is not communicable. It is almost as prevalent in the world as the common cold. There is no vaccination or "shot" for its prevention. Both tooth decay and the loss of teeth affect the general health of the individual.

Because the bacteria causing caries attack so early and continue to attack during the remainder of the victim's life, a child's interest in dental health should develop early; he should be taught the value of proper foods and habits, and the necessity for early and continued visits to the dentist.

"Each parent should teach his child, early, that his dentist is a friendly health counselor, and that irregular and unsightly teeth, no matter what their cause, can be corrected by members of the dental profession," Dr. Wertheimer said.

In addition, the parent can teach the young children the need to:

1. Visit the dentist for early and regular inspections, advice, treatment and cavity filling.
2. Eat a fortified, well-balanced diet for good growth, and a diet low in sugar content to lessen tooth decay.
3. Brush teeth properly to keep the teeth cleaner and free from particles of foods and to help stimulate healthy gums.
4. Avoid poor mouth habits such as thumb sucking and lip-biting which may make teeth uneven.
5. Use only those drugs or preparations for teeth which are prescribed by his dentist.

## BATTERY CARE WILL IMPROVE CAR STARTING

"Can't start" — motorists' winter-time headache — will plague Michigan auto owners 1,600,000 times with the loss of at least an hour each time this winter, according to Fred N. Rehm, Automobile Club of Michigan road service manager, unless they follow four simple steps outlined below. Preventable battery failure is at fault in almost all can't starts, he said.

With last year's record of 1,600,000 can't starts in the state representing a five per cent increase over the year before, Rehm sees a continuing increase in such service calls until now cars replace many more old ones — and the pre-war battery situation returns. The increase will be much smaller if all motorists winterize their cars properly, however, he pointed out.

Can't starts totalling 319,197 among Auto Club members in 1946 made up about 80 per cent of all winter-time calls. About 261,694 of the Auto Club's 575,000 total road service calls in 1946 occurred outside the Detroit area.

"Low speed driving and frequent starts run down batteries, which must furnish current to radio, heater, ignition system, defroster and other electrical equipment. Most winter trips are too short to permit much battery-charging, and the battery is the heart of the car," the Auto Club man pointed out. By using a "trickle charger," a boxlike affair which operates on ordinary house current and is plugged in simply in his own garage, the motorist can keep his battery charged and ready to start on the coldest morning, Rehm suggested.
