PARASITE CONTROL NECESSARY FOR POULTRY HEALTH

Fall weather and the housing of the pullet flock means that poul-trymen should be on the lookout for parasite infestation, advises Dr. Clarence E. Hardin, extension spe-culist in poultry diseases at Michi-gan State college.

For more examinations should be made, preferably by a qualified tetrinarian, to determine whether or not intestinal worms may be the cause of an outbreak of diesase.

Sometimes: the poultry 'flock is wormed when there is no indication of the need of worming. This practice often proves harmfall to the flock and is not recommended.


