HEAD AGRICULTURAL AGENTS

Bailey Gives Tips
On Saving Grain

Farmers should be following feeding methods that waste as little grain as possible, points out county agricultural agent Karl D. Bailey.

The following hints, recommended by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, will help to stretch the short corn crop and also to conserve other grains.

Dred sows can be handled in grain or corn fields to recover fallen grain that would ordinarily be lost, thereby saving a certain amount of harvested grains.

Pastures provide exercise, save approximately 15 per cent or more of the grain ration, and furnish valuable proteins, minerals, and vitamins. Temporary pastures of wheat, barley and rye can be utilized for light fall and winter grazing.

Good quality leaty legume hays, such as alfalfa and the clovers are excellent feeds for the brood sow and can make up as much as 50 per cent of the ration during the first half of the gestation period and reduced amounts in the latter part. When feeding this quantity, it should be ground and mixed with some grain.

Commercial hatcheries in Michigan produced about 21 million chicks during the first 8 months of 1947—21 per cent less than the approximate 27 million hatched during the same period in 1946.

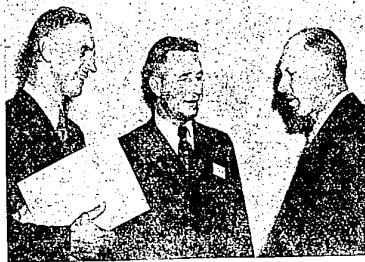
Calves should be examined for lice, as they cannot make normal gains if infested.

FARMERS' WEEK TO
FEATURE FAT STEER
SHOW JANUARY 29

Visitors at the 1947 Farmers' Week at Michigan State college will have an opportunity to see a fat steer show featuring excellent quality, according to an announcement made by Gordon Blank, MSC animal husbandry specialist.

Over 50 calves from 50 farms have been entered in the annual beef feeding project, sponsored by the animal husbandry extension department of the college. They were weighed in the project last summer during the first week of July. Steers making the required 2 pounds of gain per day over the approximate 200 day feeding period, and weighing at least 700 lbs. at the close of the project, are eligible for the show and sale which will be held Thursday, January 29.

Because of the high standards of the project, not all steers are expected to qualify for the show. However, the number will be large enough to make the show one of the largest and most competitive for beef men in the state.

Enrollment by breeds show 32 Herefords, 21 Shorthorns, 30 Angus and three Red Poll. Annual meetings of the beef breed associations will be held on Wednesday, January 28, the day before the show and sale.

Alchin Resigns To
Take New Post In
Cheboygan Office

Opportunity to become a full-fledged county agricultural agent in Cheboygan County, is given for the reason for resignation of E. W. Alchin, assistant county agricultural agent in Oakland County. Mr. Alchin has served Oakland County farmers ably and well during the past 15 months, according to Karl D. Bailey, county agricultural agent. Mr. Alchin has had charge of all livestock projects in Oakland County which includes the 5 Dairy Herd Improvement Associations, the two Artificial Breeding Associations, the Dairy Health Program and the sheep, hog and poultry programs.

Oakland County has nearly 20 per cent of its dairy cattle in herd improvement work as compared with 4 per cent for the entire state. Mr. Alchin began work in Oakland County in September of 1946, shortly after his release from the U. S. Navy. Previous to his being in the Navy for 3½ years, he was a vocational agricultural teacher at Cheboygan. He becomes county agent in Cheboygan County as result of action by the State Board of Agriculture last Wednesday.

Mr. Alchin, his wife and 2 children will move to Cheboygan on December 1, 1947. His position will be filled as soon as a new man can be obtained.

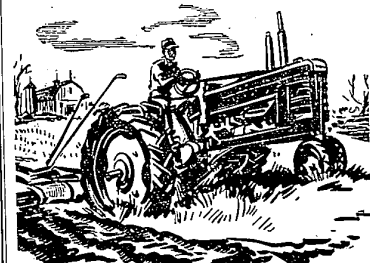
