Everyone Profits From  
Development of New Drugs

The eventful ten years of medi-  
 cine just past are only beginning to  
 be understood in regard to the re-  
 volutionary changes they have  
 brought into the practice of medi-  
 cine. Entirely apart from the now  
 well-known and widely used anti-  
 biotics and sulfonamides, there has  
 come into the medical horizon a  
 large group of natural and synthetic  
 chemicals affecting the hormonal,  
 enzymic, and synthesizing mecha-  
 nisms of the living body in health  
 and in disease. Among them are  
 vitamin K, caffeine, guarescin  
 sodium, benadryl, mechyl chlo-

ride, metrazol, placental extract,  
 dexamol, curare, histamine, py-  
 robenzamine, neostigmine, pterisin  
 and gonadotropin. Also blamuth  
 paste, barium sulfate, and nume-  
 rous other chemicals are used in  
 x-ray work. These named drugs are  
 but a few examples which are replac-  
 ing the old in the modern doctor's  
 arsenal.

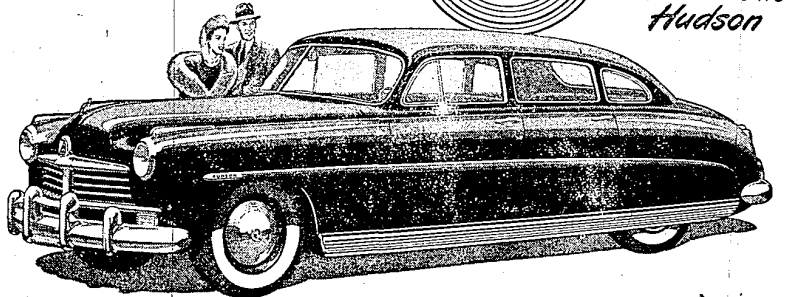

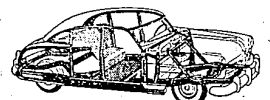
