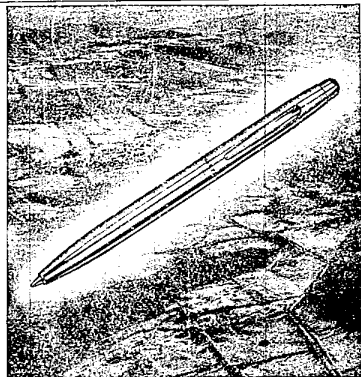

Care Needed In 1948 Livestock Business

Less favorable ratios of feed costs to livestock prices is the prospect faced by Michigan livestock raisers in 1948, according to Michigan State college animal husbandry specialists and farm economists.

G. A. Brannaman, of the college animal husbandry department, and Don Stark, MSU agricultural economist, point out that great care will be needed in purchasing, feeding and marketing if a profit is to be made in the livestock enterprise.

To help fill out short grain supplies, the specialists suggest increased use of pasture and roughage and use of high protein feeds to balance rations properly.

Prices for livestock, they believe, will remain strong as long as the consumer's income stays high with a resulting large demand for meat.

The total supply of meat in 1948 is expected to run at least seven per cent below 1947.

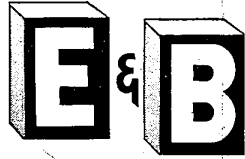
