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Items Of Veteran Interest

Nearly half of the veterans in

Ohio, Michigan and Kentucky who

are financing the purchase of

homes with the aid of G. I. loans

are buying new built houses at an

average price of \$8,200. Veterans

Administration Branch Office of

the War Relocation Authority

has announced that the remainder

of the loans were on new construc-

tion homes previously occupied, for

which sales prices averaged \$6,675.

A current monthly average of

3,000 veterans in Ohio, 2,500 in Mi-

chigan and 500 in Kentucky are

using their loan guarantee rights

for home purchases. This means

that about 1,350 new homes per

month in Ohio, 1,125 in Michigan

and 225 in Kentucky are being sold

to veterans under the program.

Since the first G. I. loan was

made late in 1944, veterans in the

three states have negotiated 115,

195 home loans through lending in-

stitutions in the amount of \$670,

600,937. The state totals include:

Ohio, 62,337 loans for \$727,709,314;

Michigan, 43,446 loans for \$315,

68,821; Kentucky, 10,413 loans for

\$52,431,402.

A revision in Veterans Admin-

istration for medical and dental

benefits will become effective Janu-

ary 1. After December 31, out-patient

medical and dental treatment or

hospitalization will not be avail-

able to veterans merely on the

presumption that their disabilities

are service connected, based on

prima facie evidence. Applications

for such treatment or hospitaliza-

tion will have to be formally ad-

judicated as service-connected be-

fore treatment other than emer-

gency can be given.

The regular permitting veter-

ans to enter hospitals or receive

out-patient medical and dental

treatment on the basis of presu-

med service-connected disabilities

has been in effect since President

Truman decreed the end of hostil-

ity a year ago. VA said this has

been sufficient time for veterans to

establish whether or not their dis-

abilities are service-connected.

Two discontinuances of determina-

tion on prima facie evidence in no

way denies veterans any rights

they are granted by law, nor does

it limit services given those whose

conditions are rated as service-

connected, VA emphasized.
