Judges for the contest were Joe and Reta Doda, both members of the Michigan Audubon Society and past board members of the Detroit Audubon Society.


FHS Sends 5 Abroad

Disabled Class Changes Will Be Explained

The format of the present program will be changed during the school year 1972-73 to serve learning disabled children more effectively and with the goal of presenting needed remedial and compensatory training within the mainstream of the elementary program, says Cunio.

A vital part of the new program will be the development of special learning centers through the school district, adds Smith.


