TALENTED SOLOIST APPEARS WITH ORCHESTRA

Leo Nadelmann, composer-pianist, was the assisting artist with the Detroit Symphony February 12 and 13 at Music Hall. Performing the Mozart Concerto in G Major, Mr. Nadelmann displayed his genius for perfection of form and delicate rhythms. Both critics and audience were duly impressed with his interpretation of the Mozart work.

Born in Basel, Switzerland, he made his early pianistic studies with Arthur Schnabel and Rudolf Serkin, and his debut was effected in Berlin at the age of 15.

Before his appearance in America last summer, he had played with every leading orchestra of England, France, Germany, Austria, Spain, Switzerland, Holland, Poland, Hungary, Czechoslovakia and Italy.

Considered to be not only Switzerland's greatest concert pianist but the country's finest composer as well, Mr. Nadelmann has already left his mark in the musical world. In addition, he is an accomplished linguist, speaking and writing six languages. At present he hopes to remain in the United States and is applying for his U.S. citizenship.

Planned in a religious vein for the opening of Lent, the program commenced with the Fricolite from Wagner's "Parsifal." Following the concerto, Mr. Nadelmann played one of his own compositions, "Lamentation," a solemn, melancholy portrait, which had its radio premiere February 15.

NEW SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE TO HONOR STUDENTS

Opportunities for scholarships for the seniors of Farmington High School have been increased by the addition of scholarships offered by the Central Michigan College of Education, in Mount Pleasant, Michigan, and Michigan State College.

The awards offered from Central Michigan College are known as Freshman Scholarships. They are made possible through the State Board of Education and the generosity of individuals interested in providing college training for worthy students. They cover the tuition and certain fees for one year. To be eligible the student must rank in the upper fourth of his class, and must show qualities of initiative, leadership, and dependability. He should also plan to complete work for a degree, the usual four year course. Preference will be given applicants for the teaching profession. Any high school graduate interested in the two-year limited course to prepare for elementary teaching should apply for a Rural Scholarship.

The Alumni Undergraduate Scholarships offered by Michigan State College are available only to students from accredited Michigan high schools who are entering college as freshmen either in the summer or fall term. There are sixty-four awarded a year. Applications must be filed before April 15. Candidates are nominated by the alumni clubs or alumni committees in cooperation with the high school principals, from the upper one-third of the high school class.

The stipend is \$45 each of the three terms for one year. This is a waiver by the College of the term fee, exclusive of matriculation.

Any senior who is interested in either scholarship should make an appointment to see Mr. Harrison as soon as possible. D.G.

LIBRARY REVIEW THE AMERICAN READER

This volume brings to the reader three outstanding books dealing with absorbing periods of American history and narrated by three different authors.

The first of these three books, "Standing Room Only," by Elizabeth Fowler, is a personal and moving record of a woman's experience during ten days in a life boat with thirty-four men after their ship had been torpedoed by a German submarine.

The second book, "The American House," written by Virginia Chase, is the amusing tale of unusual happenings which befell the family of the town's doctor after his purchase of the town's hotel.

The third and last author, Howard Fast, produces a stirring biographical novel based on the life of a comparatively insignificant hero of the Revolution entitled "Citizen Tom Paine".

Humor, tense drama and changeable backgrounds afford fascinating reading in this popular, unusual book. D.S.K.
