Mr. Robert Still of Floral Avenue sang at a wedding in Detroit Saturday. From there he went on to another wedding, where he also was "soloist."

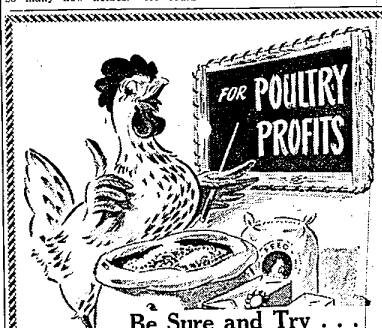
Mrs. Robert Still's sister, Virginia Smith, was home for the week end. Miss Smith is a student at Albion College.
