DEMAND FOR OFFICE OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS SERVICES INCREASES

The demand for the services rendered by the State Office of Veterans' Affairs continues to increase. In 1947, 423,850 veterans requested and received assistance through its programs, as compared to 422,721 in 1946. The 1947 figure represents 59.8 per cent of all World War II veterans in the state. One of the programs operated by the Office of Veterans' Affairs which is supplying a much needed service is the Mental Adjustment Program. The main objective of this program is to provide early preventive service for veterans who are mentally disturbed.

The Office of Veterans' Affairs has established throughout the state 20 Psychiatric Clinics and Psychiatric Screening Centers. Veterans are channeled from the Community Counseling Centers to the Clinics where psychiatric examinations and treatments are given without cost to the veteran.

If a veteran does not react favorably to the treatments given at the Clinics, he is referred to the Veterans' Readjustment Center at Ann Arbor, a project of the Office of Veterans' Affairs, administered by the Neuropsychiatric Institute of the University Hospital, and hospitalized. The urgent need for these services is reflected from the fact that 3,322 veterans have received 7,352 examinations and outpatient treatments at these local Veterans' Clinics. Of this number, 371 have been admitted to the Readjustment Center for further treatment. An evaluation of this program reveals that more than 90 per cent of veterans showed complete recovery or improvement.

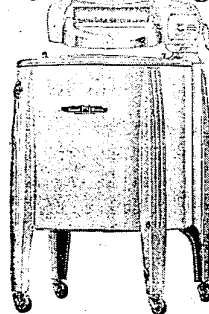
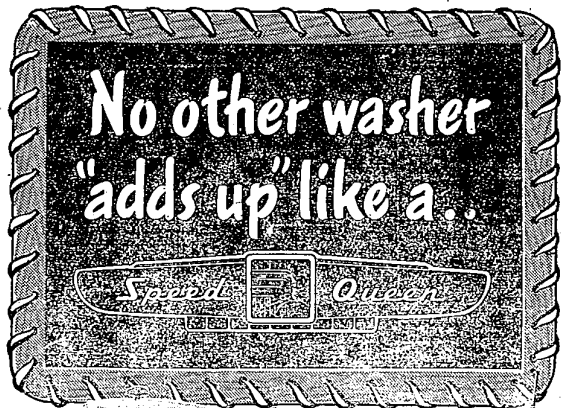
