Michigan Mirror (Continued from Page Two) of senators and representatives would remain at two years. Speaker Victor A. Kees of the so-called "There is a feeling among many members that if we are to grant a four-year term to the governor, the same reasoning would apply to the legislature itself." And there you have it - human nature inevitably in action, linking a man's program to change to his personal ambitions. Governor Sigler points out that since the 1935 constitution was adopted, only five governors have served more than one term. "Most of the time we have had a shift of administration every two years. In the light of these facts, can one wonder why a well planned program of state government has not been carried out? "Does anyone seriously contend that a worthwhile program can be accomplished in two years? ... Governors are not in office long enough to lay out a program and see it through. "As for greater power for the governor, there is a quotation from Sigler's message to the legislature: "It is the governor to whom the people look for administrative accomplishment, and whom they blame for lack of it. The tools of administration, however, have not been provided to enable the chief executive of our state to fulfill this responsibility. ... There should be authority commensurate with that responsibility." Governor Sigler asks the legislature to create a state department of administration which would take over function of numerous state boards and agencies. The governor would appoint its director. This department would handle budget, purchasing and accounting. This department would give the governor, says Sigler, "the means to get a job done," a "right arm" in his power to get results. It is a good illustration of what Kim Sigler wants.

County Army Enlistees To Go To 24th Division The Oakland County Army and Air Force recruiting area has assumed responsibility for filling the depleted ranks of the 24th "Victory" Division, now stationed 25 miles north of Tokyo in Japan, according to T-Sgt. James B. Landie, area commander, which was on Oahu when the Japs pulled their sneak punch at Pearl Harbor, subsequently hit the Japs 13 times all the way from Hollandia to Corregidor. Their most strenuous engagement was on the island of Layte where the "Victory" Division bore the brunt of the fighting. On this one island, they fought for 18 consecutive days, killing a counted 1,179 Japs. Recent Oakland County enlistees for direct assignment to the 24th Division include Richard D. Vogt, 17, Pontiac; Lester R. Bennett, 15, Davison Plains; Fred M. Carroll, 31, Clarkston; Donald L. Biddle, 17, Oxford; Walter G. Salverson, 17, and Richard M. Santamore, 17, both of Ferndale; Roger L. Wood, 17, Royal Oak. Former members of the 24th Division throughout Oakland County are requested to volunteer their services in keeping their old unit together to strength.
