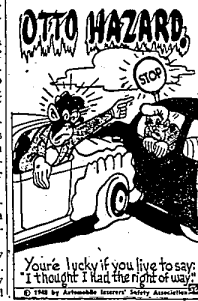
A group of Rebekah ladies attended a district meeting at Lansing on Monday. Luncheon was served, followed by a business meeting.
