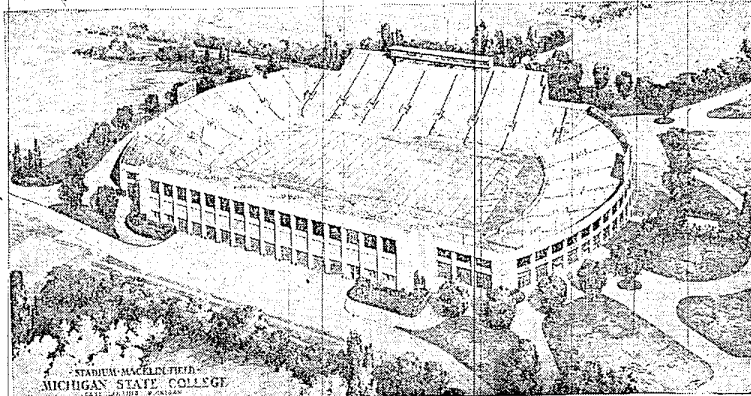

## New Football Stadium Rises At Michigan State College



Pictured here is the architect's drawing of Michigan State college's new football stadium on Macklin Field, construction of which is well under way. The view is looking from the east to the west stands on which rises the double decked press box. The bowl-like structure involves expanding the former Macklin Field stadium of some 24,000 seats to a new capacity of 50,410. Sideline sections of the former stadium are being increased from 46 to 68 rows, with

13,777 seats on the east side and 12,126 on the west. The end zones, formerly of 11 rows, are being increased to 46. The north end will hold 11,570 seats and the south end 11,566. The press box will seat 274 persons. Dedication of the new structure will take place September 25 with the 41st renewal of the Michigan-Michigan State football series.

## LATEST WORD IN JACKET BLURB

Here are two reviews of new books which have been added recently to the Farmington Library: Coleman, "Volcanoes, Old and New". Satis N. Coleman is one of the most noted music educators of the United States. Music was her entire career until one day in the summer of 1942, when she traveled to Mexico, like hundreds of other sightseers, to witness the eruption of Paricutin, the first new volcano to break forth in the western hemisphere for more than a century and a half. This book tells all about Paricutin. It also tells of many other volcanoes and has 97 illustrations of volcanoes and has 97 new. It is written for the general reader of all age levels, and tells much of its story through the remarkable illustrations.

Dallin and Nicolaevsky, "Forced Labor in Soviet Russia". One of the most important elements in the life of Soviet Russia and one about which least is known by the outside world is the forced labor of millions of people. Workers, peasants, intellectuals, party officials, even members of the secret police, have been taken from their various occupations and homes, and transported to the bleak wastes of the north, to forests, to mines, to construction projects of all kinds. Sometimes with the aid of machinery but more often with their bare hands, they have dug the foundations of the Soviet economy and have kept it going. They have died of exhaustion, punishment and disease, but the supply is endless. The book is the record, made with great care out of hundreds of documents and eyewitness accounts, of the return in the twentieth century to slave labor as an institution of government. There are millions of these people and to understand what they are doing and how they fit into the economy is to take a long view into the springs of the Soviet State.

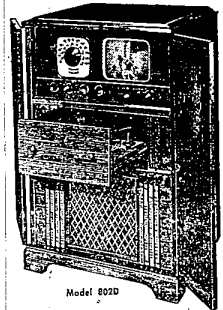
