Farmers Advised To Purchase Insecticides Now

Early purchase of insecticides needed this year is advised by coun-ty agricultural agent Karl D. Bail-

ty agricultural agent Nati D. Bail-ey.

Reports from all parts of the nation say that farmers have been slow in determining their insecti-cide and fungleide needs. Many find it hard to make up their mind on what kind and how much they want. Others have delayed buying because they think the price of in-secticides containing DDT may go

secticities containing DDT may go down.
Economists say that although some déclines have been noted, prices are fairly steady now. For the nation as a whole, the supply of nicotine insecticities is better than last year. However the supply still continues below the demand and need.
Enough 'pyrethrum is on hand. Rotenone insecticides are in good supply now but may run short during the latter part of the season. Supplies of lead arsenate and calcium arsenate are probably sufficient to meet this year's needs.

For Swine Saves Grain

When grain prices are high and the margin of profit in swine feed-ing is small, it is especially import-ant to use pasture to the fullest extent, believes W. N. McMillen, animal husbandry specialist at Mihigan State College.

All spring pigs should be put on
pasture at once, the specialist
points out. If a pasture program
has not been planned, it is a good
idea to fence off a corner of a field
of alfalfa, clover or alfalfa and
brome grass mixture and turn in
the pigs.

Blue grass and other permanent astures can be used the next weeks, but other pastures will few weeks, but other pastures will be needed when permanent pastures dry up during the summer. Rape and oats can be sown so that they will be available for pusture within a few weeks. Sudan grass may also be available a little later this spring.
