Trojans Win Two

Park got their only hit of the afternoon, a single, in the sixth inning. However, the batter was unable to get any further. Clarenceville added a final run in the sixth inning to bring the score to 9 to 0. A single by Rousseaux, a stolen base and another Allen Park error totaled up to another run for the Trojans. The game ended with Clarenceville way out in front 9 to 0.

Clarenceville had to go ten innings to finally win a close 7 to 6 contest from Dearborn Roosevelt on the Clarenceville diamond. The Trojans outbatted Dearborn 12 hits to 6 and committed only 4 errors to Dearborn's six. Jerry Heaphy started pitching for the Trojans but was relieved by Rousseaux in the third. Rousseaux was the winning pitcher.

Clarenceville opened the scoring in the second inning to take a two run lead. A single by Grose, an error, two pass balls and a fielder's choice gave the Trojans their opening score. Dearborn came back in the third inning to take the lead on three walks, two errors, batter hit by a pitched ball and a fielder's choice. The Trojans tied it up at three all in their half of the third on Rousseaux's double, a walk, a stolen base and a pass ball.

The Trojans jumped into the lead in the fourth inning, scoring two runs on Estep's single, an error, a pass ball and a single by Rutla. However, Dearborn tied it all up again in the fifth inning on a double, a walk and a fielder's choice. They then took the lead in the first half of the seventh on two walks and two singles. But the Trojans tied it up in their half of the seventh when Roberts walked, Rousseaux singled, Albers sacrificed and Roberts scored when Gordon grounded out.

The game was finally won in the tenth inning when Sonnenberg singled, the ball bouncing off the fielder's leg, Sonnenberg going to third. He then scored when the fielder threw the ball over third. The final score was Clarenceville 7 - Dearborn Roosevelt 6.
