Unemployment Checks -
Must Be Properly Signed

Banks and neighborhood merchants who cash Michigan Unemployment Compensation Commission benefit checks for claimants are warned by S. J. McLeod, Branch Manager of the M.U.C.C. Local Office at 16310 Grand River Avenue, that the signature of the payee on the reverse side of the check is necessary to validate payment. Failure to have the claimant properly endorse the check by signing their name on the back of the check makes it necessary for the bank or the M.U.C.C. office to return the check to the payee for signature.

McLeod stated that merchants frequently misconstrue the meaning of the claimant's signature on the back of the check as an endorsement, whereas this signature, required at the time of issuance of the check, certifies to seven conditions of eligibility which are printed above the space for the claimant's signature. This does not constitute a valid endorsement as the reverse side of the check must also be signed at the time of cashing the check. The cooperation of merchants cashing benefit checks is solicited.

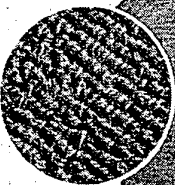
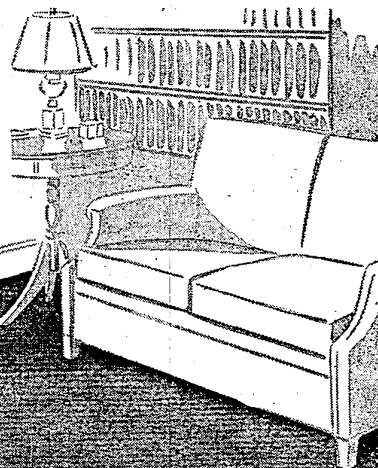
