### Lightning Causes High Number of Farm Fires

Lightning is nature's artillery. That is the way Fred Roth, farm safety specialist at Michigan State college describes the danger of lightning which causes 37 percent of all farm fires.

Each year lightning destroys approximately \$20,000,000 worth of farm property in the United States. It takes the lives of 500 people and injures 1300 others, according to National Safety Council records.

A building adequately equipped with lightning rods offers the best protection. Roth points out. If you are working in a field and do not have time to seek protection of a rod building, lie down in a low spot in the field, away from wire fences, trees.
