Last year more than 4,000 school children were injured in what one educator calls those big "sheet metal cof-fins."

Presently no state nor the federal government requires seat belts and padded backrests in busses. Congressman Broomfield stated that the American Society of Oral Surgeons reported over 1300 children were injured when they were thrown against the seat ahead of them.
