Festival Concert Opens Music Week Locally

A festival concert in Harrison High School will begin the 49th observance of National Music Week on Sunday, May 7.

The concert, held in the Harrison auditorium, will begin at 3 p.m. The school is located at 29995 W. 12 Mile.

Tickets, available at the door, are \$2.50 per family, \$1 for adults and 50 cents for students. Proceeds will go to the music departments of Farmington Public Schools.

THE CONCERT is the first of many events for National Music Week, May 7-13, which is sponsored locally by the Farmington Musicales, an affiliate of the National Federation of Music Clubs.

Other activities will include concerts in local schools and daily entertainment at the Tel-Twelve Mall in Southfield.

Appearing as soloists at the Festival Concert May 7 will be the first place winners of the Farmington Musicales' 1972 scholarship contest held in March.

They are: Kristy Nielson, piano; Debbie Tomchak, brass; and Anne Osterdale, winds. All three attend Harrison High School.

From North Farmington High School are Dave Anderson, voice, and Carolyn Mekjian, strings. All first, second and third place winners will receive their monetary scholarship awards at the concert.

THE CONCERT program, a joint effort of the Musicales and music departments of Farmington Public Schools, are:

The Clarinet Choir, directed by Mrs. Fern Barber, consisting of musicians from Farmington Schools' junior highs and high schools; the Twelve-Tones of Farmington High School, a singing group directed by William Feucht; and the Harrison High School Stage Band.

Featured also will be performances by the

Farmington Community Concert Band, directed by Paul Barber, and the Farmington Musicales Chorus led by Sue McCallum.

Farmington will be well represented at the Tel-Twelve Mall during the week long celebration. The Harrison Stage Band will perform Monday, May 8, at 7:30 p.m.

The Farmington Junior High Concert Band will perform Thursday, May 11, at 7:30 p.m. and Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic School's singing Mercyaires of Farmington will perform Friday, May 12, at 7:30 p.m.

On Saturday, May 13, at 1:30 p.m., Steve Bucci, a young organist from Dunckel Junior High, will perform.

All activities at the Mall, at 12 Mile and Telegraph, are open to the public and admission free.
