Bailey Gives Tips On Grain Storage

Grain harrest is not too far in the fature. County agricultural agricu

bin swept clean. The second step is to make the bin light so insects and rodents cannot enter. After those two chores are done, spraying for the control of weevils and other insects should be begun.

For grain stored for feed or cereal products, a spray containing five per cent or less of DDT in refined, deedorried Meroseno or in water suspensions or emulsions should be used. It should be applied to the walls and woodwork at a rate of not more than ane gallon of spray per 1,000 square feet, The spray should be therethly dry before grain is put in the bin. If the grain is to be stored for seed purposes, a different treatment should be used. Dust of 3-per cent 10Tf in prophyllite, thoroughly miked with the seed, applied at the rate of one-half ounce proper treatment.

NEW MICHIGAN PASTEURIZATION

LAW TAKES EFFECT

LAW TAKES EFFECT

July first is the date that Michigan's new milk pasteurization law takes effect, reports A. C. Baltzer, extension dartyman at Michigan State college. Beginning then, all milk entering commercial channels, must be pasteurized. Michigan is the first state in the nation to enact such a law to safeguard against certain communicable diseases. The law was passed by the legislature in 1947 to give those concerned a year to prepare for it. Baltzer advises that under the new law, all milk to be bottled for retail trade or used in creameries and cheese factories must be pas-
