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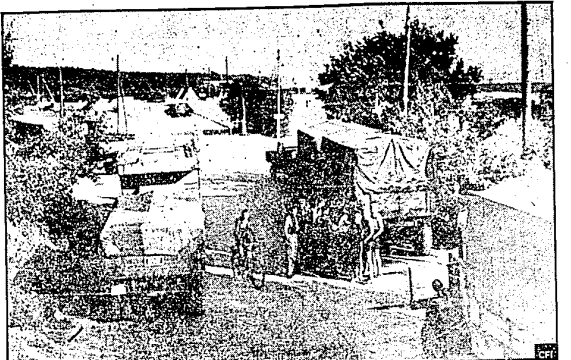

The latest thing in marriage counseling, the Cana Conference has two places on the summer calendar of the Detroit Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women.

Aids Wonder Drugs
Soybeans are helping produce streptomycin, newest and rarest of the "wonder drugs." A nutrient made from the beans is being used in place of a meat extract for growing the mold that produces streptomycin. It may double the yield. Streptomycin is effective in many infections which resist penicillin and sulfa. It also shows promise in aiding recovery from tuberculosis.

Castor Oil
Castor oil has many industrial uses. It lubricates internal combustion engines. It is used in the manufacture and processing of such varied products as artificial leather, leather lubricants, linoleums, typewriter inks, rubber, shellac and varnish, dypaper, transparent soaps and medicinal preparations. It is used as a lubricated oil in the making of Turkey red oil, a compound widely demanded in the dyeing and cloth-printing industry. Castor oil also is utilized as a plaster in plastic, manmade fibers. Recent advances in dehydrating the oil will make it possible to use it as a substitute or amendment to tung oil in the drying oil industry. The pulp leaves and stems can be used in making fertilizers, plastics, chemicals, cloth and cordage, insecticides and paper for boxes.

Bell Telephone Rate Case Delayed For More Study

The Michigan Bell Telephone Company rate case is in recess until some time in July with the possibility of a serious delay in proceedings arising out of the company's application for a \$10,000,000 rate increase filed last August has been read into the record. James W. Williams, special counsel for the Michigan Public Service Commission mentioned that possibility in outlining further proceedings.

After Karl F. Oehler, Michigan Bell's counsel, had protested against any delay by reason of further studies, the city of Detroit through counsel served notice it will oppose any interim order.

The Commission's staff has asked for further audit and appraisal studies in 18 outstate exchanges while the city of Detroit wants a similar study and a physical inventory of company properties in Detroit. Estimates on the time for such studies range from one month to 1½ years.

John W. Kishling, chief engineer for the Commission, has suggested a new method of fixing rates based upon costs of providing the service in each exchange, rather than value of the service to the customer. He favors subsidies for small exchanges, however, "when the need is demonstrated."

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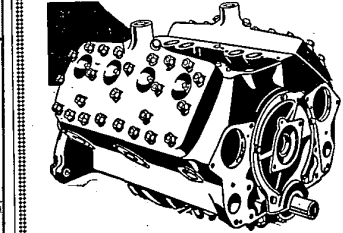
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
