

**Vacation Highlights**  
 by  
**The Old AAA Traveler**  
 of the bloody massacre in 1763. A  
 replica of the old fort has been  
 built.  
 Of course we park the car at  
 Mackinac Island, for that auto-  
 mobileless vacation paradise is an  
 "must" for everyone who likes  
 the unusual. From end to  
 end Mackinac Island is filled with  
 interest. . . Arch Rock where, In-  
 dian legend has it, Gitchie Manitou  
 passed through on his landing  
 place to his home in Sugar Loaf.  
 . . Sugar Loaf itself, where the In-  
 dians believed that the Great Spirit  
 was fed by the bees. . . Old Fort  
 Mackinac, overlooking the harbor,  
 built by the British in 1780 and re-  
 stored to its original condition.  
 . . Skull Cave, where Alexander Hen-  
 ry, one of the few survivors of the  
 massacre, was fed by his adopted  
 brother, famous Chief Wawatam.  
 . . The John Jacob Astor trading post  
 . . the old cemetery in which  
 sleep those identified with the early  
 days on the island. . . the monu-  
 ment to Jean Nicolet . . . on and on  
 and on until you find it hard to be-  
 lieve that you actually are seeing  
 such spots in this modern world  
 of ours.  
 Next we'll swing southward into  
 Petoskey on Little Traverse Bay,  
 westward at Levering and go into  
 Cross Village, an almost wholly In-  
 dian town, and follow the mag-  
 nificent scenic highway along the  
 bluffs high over Lake Michigan.  
 This drive from Cross Village and  
 into Harbor Springs is to my way  
 of thinking, one of the most beau-  
 tiful drives in all of Michigan.  
 If you're interested in Indians . .  
 and who isn't . . . you'll find 'em  
 all along this stretch of country.  
 Around Petoskey descendants of  
 Chief Peto-sagah still till the soil,  
 and throughout the area there are  
 colorful individuals who might have  
 stepped from the pages of a best  
 seller.  
 The Traverse City section is a  
 vacation paradise in its own right,  
 notably the famous Leelanau Pen-  
 insula, with its Lake Leelanau and  
 its Glen Lake. There are North-  
 port and Northport Point for lake  
 trout trolling and there are the  
 world-famous Sleeping Bear Dunes  
 high above Lake Michigan.  
 Of course you'll look in on Inter-  
 lochen and the National Music  
 Camp, for there assemble the great  
 of the musical world through the  
 summer months.  
 Right down on the coast we travel  
 with a little time for Bandie  
 State Park on Platte Lake, a few  
 hours on beautiful Crystal Lake  
 around Beulah and a look-see at  
 Frankfort, an important port on  
 the western shores of the lake.  
 Southward out of Frankfort you  
 have more lakes and more state  
 parks and we'll see Manistee and  
 Ludington, with its Ludington  
 State Park and Orchard Lake State  
 Park at Manistee, and, just a  
 bit inland, the great expanse of  
 Manistee National Forest, one of  
 the largest national forest areas in  
 the state.  
 On southward out of Ludington  
 into Silver Lake State Park and  
 Whitehall on White Lake and then  
 Muskegon on Muskegon Lake and  
 on Lake Michigan, with the beau-  
 tiful expanse that is Muskegon State  
 Park and the surrounding country.

It would be a bootless task even  
 to attempt to parade a detailed  
 treatise on where to go and what to  
 see, so we'll just point of direction  
 here and there, and hit the high  
 spots . . . or highlights . . . in  
 this magnificent plays which we  
 have at our very door.  
 Well start in Bay City, with the  
 lake of Saginaw Bay to the east-  
 ward, and northward a trail lead-  
 ing into the beauty that is in the  
 Ogemaw State Forest, the Houghton  
 National Forest, the Huron  
 National Forest and the Au Sable  
 State Forest. Out of Bay City we  
 follow U.S. 23 along the coast  
 into Tawas City and East Tawas  
 and on to Oshtemo. From Oshtemo  
 we swing inland along the Au Sable  
 into Huron National Forest for a  
 glimpse of the famous Lumberman's  
 Monument.  
 Back in Oscoda and heading up  
 the coast, we skirt Van Etan Lake  
 and Cedar Lake, see Greenbush  
 and Harrisville State Park and roll  
 on into Alpena, on beautiful Tim-  
 der Bay. This Alpena is a beau-  
 tiful spot and one of the state's  
 most outstanding vacation towns.  
 Out of Alpena we head northward  
 into Rogers City and on into Black  
 Lake State Forest.  
 On into Cheboygan we go, the  
 Cheboygan with its Mullet Lake  
 and Alpa State Park, and there  
 are Port Lake and Douglas Lake  
 all favored playgrounds. From Che-  
 boygan into Mackinac City we are  
 skirting the blue waters across  
 which we see Bois Blanc Island,  
 Round Island and Mackinac Is-  
 land in the distance.  
 Once in Mackinac City we are in  
 an entrancing place in its own  
 right, what with Indians strolling  
 its streets and entrancing Michi-  
 linacine State Park, site of old  
 Fort Michilimackinac and scene
