Although complete figures for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1948, were not yet available due to the fact that some fine monies had not been received by the City Clerk...

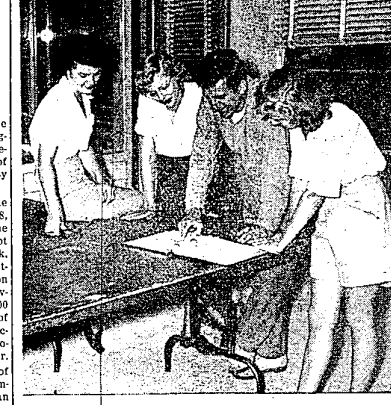

HULETT & PHENEY MOVE OFFICES TO NEW LOCATION

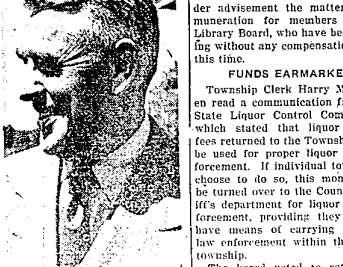
The law firm of Hullett and Phenevy has moved its office from the old location at the corner of the American Legion Post. The property was purchased by Max Hullett last November...
