Plan To Finish Road To Harrisville Park Soon

Moving promptly to get the newly authorized entrance road to Harrisville state park built this year, if possible, the conservation department's parks division has applied to the Michigan Public Service Commission for a bond to build the road.

If possible, the conservation department's parks division has applied to the Michigan Public Service Commission for a grade crossing permit over Detroit and Mackinac Island roads. The department has plans and specifications for the job while park engineers are completing their survey.

The 22-foot gravel road will be only about a quarter-mile long, but it will require considerable earth fill over the 100-foot-wide road. The new road was purchased and presented to the state by Harpaville citizens who believe the new

entrance will be more convenient and attractive to tourists.

A conservation commission, allotment of \$11,000 for the job covers planning, engineering and construction supervision costs, as well as the actual contract for fill, grading, drainage and gravel surfacing.
