Michigan beef cattle producers and feedlot operators will again have an opportunity this year of attending the four-day tour of northern beef cattle regions.

The tour is being planned cooperatively by county agricultural agents, the Michigan State College animal husbandry department, the directors of the two northern Michigan feeder calf producer associations and the Michigan Hereford Cattle Breeders' association.

Present plans call for the tour to start in Ogemaw county on Tuesday, August 17, and continue through Isco, Alcona, Alpena, Presque Isle, and Cheboygan counties, ending Friday afternoon with a visit to the Cheboygan county fair.

The members of the tour will see some excellent herds and also witness demonstrations of cattle sorting and grading, pasture management, legume seed production, and parasite control. Other features will include fishing, visiting deer herd areas, boating and a visit to the Limestone plants at Rogers City.

Details of the tour can be obtained from county agricultural agents or by writing to the Animal Husbandry department, Michigan State college, East Lansing, Michigan.
