TRAVEL BOOKS OFFERED FOR SUMMER READING

For those spending a vacation at home, what is better than a good travel book? The Farmington Library has the following new ones, as well as some older ones.

"The Land of the Shorter Shadows" is Baja, California and the author, Eric Stanley Gardner, famous for detective stories. He shows great admiration for the Mexican people and writes in an interesting fashion of their land.

"Lands of the Inner Sea" is written by W. Adolphe Roberts and belongs to the "Invitation to Travel" series. The author was born in Jamaica and is an authority on the Caribbean Sea. There are chapters on Haiti, Bermuda, Cuba and the three Guianas, which, although on the South American continent, have similar histories.

"The National Road" is by P. D. Jordan and belongs to the "American Trail" series. He gives an account of the actual construction of the pipe from the first survey to the final surfacing. The book is also a chronicle of the people and events of the time. The trail is what is now U.S. 40. It used to be called Cumberbund Road, Ohio's Road, The Great Western Road and Uncle Sam's Road.

"The Building of the Burma Road" is the story told by the Chinese engineer who planned and executed the project. Through his description of the untrained men and women who built the road we learn a great deal about the Chinese people and their country.

Katherine Crowley is the author of "Blue Water Men and Other Cape Codders". These are pleasantly chatty stories of the Cape towns and people, especially those of the period between the era of the clipper ship and the automobile. The material is a good supplement to guidebooks.

"The Great Smokies and the Blue Ridge" has many authors but is edited by Roderick Peattie. This book is equally good for the stay at home or the one who plans a trip to the Blue Ridge. Some of the history is given of the country, what to expect at the different seasons, and descriptions of its trees, flowers and people.

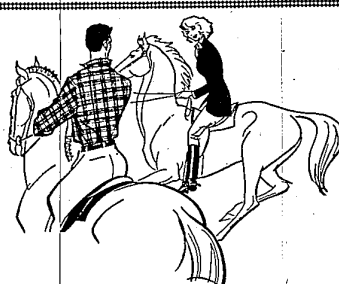
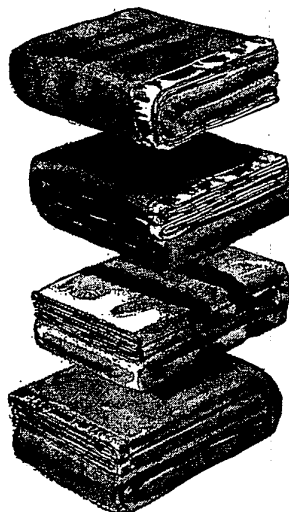

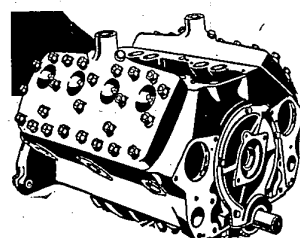
