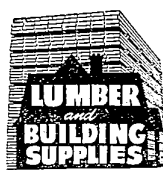

## Bailey Gives Tips To Sheep Raisers

The amount and quality of wool harvested next spring depends a great deal on several important sheep management practices which need attention now, according to Karl D. Bailey, county agricultural agent.

Graydon Blank, extension sheep specialist at Michigan State college, has supplied the agent with a timely list of tips for sheep raisers. He reports that burry, seedy wool brings a much lower price than good clean wool. During late summer sheep pick up burrs and other foreign material of this nature if allowed to come in contact with them. Permanent pastures should be checked for burdock and other weeds of this type. When sheep are turned in second cutting hay fields, or when allowed to clean up grain fields after harvest, fence rows and other out-of-the-way places should be checked for burdock and other plants whose seeds adhere to wools. Sheep are sure to pick up burrs from even one plant that is left.

Ticks and lice also lower the quality and quantity of wool produced. There is still time to control these parasites by dipping with arsenical dips or spraying thoroughly with wettable D.D.T. at the rate of four pounds of the 50 per cent wettable powder to 100 gallons of water. A power sprayer should be used and each sheep wet thoroughly.

Control of internal parasites by using a salt and phenothiazine mixture made up of one pound of phenothiazine to 12 or 14 pounds of salt, or by drenching with phenothiazine, improves the health and vigor of the sheep and results in a heavier growth of wool.

## SPECIALIST GIVES TIPS TO STATE CATTLE RAISERS

Fat cows and heifers and heavy bulls intended for slaughter may well be marketed any time now while prices are high and demand is great, advises George A. Brannan, animal husbandry specialist at Michigan State College.

Sometimes steers and heifers are kept on the farm after grass is short and dry and there may be actual loss in weight. Prices for slaughter cattle off grass will doubtless drop some in weeks to come, Brannan believes. Second growth in hay fields is often used best by opening the gate and allowing cattle to go back and forth from the dry pasture. September rains are expected to start the grass again and additional gains on unfinished cattle continue until hard frosts and freezing. Cattle quit gaining and often lose weight after hard frosts. Cattle started on feed early will help ease the meat situation and also get in ahead of more liberal runs of hogs.

It is often best to start feeding green corn in the milk stage, or to feed oats, barley and wheat, rather than to allow cattle to drift or lose weight on exhausted pastures. Most complete use of a corn crop is obtained when fed green from the field after the corn has denting, Brannan advises. Cattle men in some Michigan areas turn steers into the corn field when kernels are well denting and they have been well pleased with the results for several years.

Extremely heavy runs of cattle on the market are not expected unless severe drought areas develop. Herds have been cull closely with breeding stock sold out completely in some cases. The specialist concludes that grass cattle will soon be coming to market more liberally; but if a big corn crop eludes drought and frost, there will doubtless be strong demand for feeder cattle.

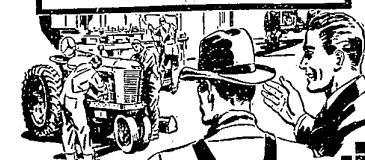

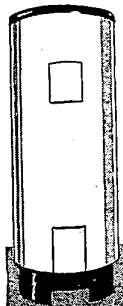
