(Continued from Page Two) bought land at Plum's harbor, later called Small Shell because of its shape, from Irvin C. Squires, built limestone kilns through the peninsula to convert hardwood into charcoal; extended a narrow-gauge railroad to Fairport at the tip; and then constructed huge furnaces at Fayette to smelt the iron-ore, shipped from Escanaba, into pig iron for loading into sailing vessels bound for Cleveland.

It took eight days to char the hardwood in the kilns. Twenty-five bushels of charcoal were consumed in the furnaces to produce one ton of pig iron. The virgin hardwoods of the Garden peninsula were literally burned up! Fayette was a company-owned town — houses, hotel, stores, church, dance-hall and furnaces. The place was abandoned in 1850.

Bonifas' logging camp became the William Bonifas Company with three brothers — John, Jim and Fred — as partners. When Bill left the peninsula in 1917, he threw a big party at the Garden town hall — champagne and all. Worth then acquired \$500,000. Bill formed the William Bonifas Lumber Company at Escanaba.

Sawmills were operated at Marquette and Lake Linden. Full-time operations were maintained all over the Upper Peninsula. By fortunate investments, Bonifas acquired large blocks of Kimberly-Clark and General Motors stocks. It was a rich man.

When Bill died several years ago he left a million dollars to build a new St. Joseph's church at Escanaba including a rectory, auditorium and gymnasium. Kate donated \$150,000 for a new public school and convent in the village of Garden.

When she died early this summer she left \$250,000 to Escanaba — new Catholic Central high school, public high school, city hall, court house, public office building and city recreational facilities.

Thus, the wealth from the woods at Garden and the Upper Peninsula has come back, in part, to the land which Bill and Kate Bonifas got their start. Remember this when you visit the Garden peninsula, just west of Manistiquie.

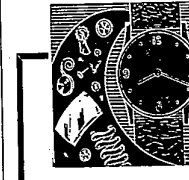

Private First Class Wendell G. TWO LOCAL MEN RECEIVE DEGREES FROM U. OF M.

ABA COOPERATIVE TO DEDICATE NEW MSC BARN

Completion of arrangements for the dedication of the new bull barn erected by the Michigan Artificial Breeders Cooperative, located at Michigan State College, was announced this week by A. C. Baltzer, MSC extension dairyman and secretary of the group.

The purpose of the program on September 14 is to have members of localities throughout Michigan come in to inspect the premises, to see the bulls that they own, and to become more familiar with the arrangements at the bull barn.

The new barn, a Quonset 40 building, will be open for inspection from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. President Wesley Mahaffy will preside at a short speaking program beginning at 1:15 p.m. E. L. Anthony, dean of the MSC school of agriculture, and Charles Figy, director of the Michigan State Department of Agriculture, will appear on the afternoon program.

In tracing the development of the ABA, Baltzer relates that since January 1 when 108 groups were organized, 20 new organizations have been added bringing the total to 128 now active in more than 60 Michigan counties. In addition, there are nearly 16,000 herd owners with almost 320,000 dairy cows using the organization through 150 artificial breeding associations which are affiliates of the Michigan Artificial Breeders Cooperative.

Baltzer predicts that the goal of 150 artificial breeding associations will be achieved in 1948. Local boards of directors and interested farmers are planning to travel to East Lansing on September 14 for the bull barn dedication.
