

**HAND WROUGHT SILVER IS TOPIC AT TOWN CLUB**

Members of The Town Club and their guests were very much interested in the program they enjoyed at their regular meeting last Thursday evening.

Mrs. Marion Kinney Eagen, who works with her husband, Frederick, in the design and creation of hand wrought silver, was the guest of The Town Club. On display before she began her talk was a beautiful collection of sterling silver, including compotes, jewelry and cigarette boxes, pin boxes, salt and sugar shakers, sugar and creamer sets, a tea pot, bowls, bracelets, necklaces, one of which was inlaid with gold, earrings and many other items.

Mrs. Eagen and her husband both instruct classes in the making of fine silver, and she outlined the work in making any of these articles, explaining how the design is first drawn on paper, the materials determined, and then the annealing and pounding of the silver is begun. She told of soldering the different pieces, showing how some articles had to be soldered nine or ten different times, or perhaps of baking them to coat them with enamel, or set them with stones.

Mrs. Eagen showed the tools which are used in fashioning hand wrought silver; the silver dies and silver wire which are used; she showed some partially made articles, telling what yet had to be done on them, and giving some of the hours of work necessary to complete even the smallest item.

She closed her talk by answering questions about her work, and about sterling silver of both the commercial and hand wrought types.

During the business session which preceded Mrs. Eagen's talk, several new members were introduced, and plans for coming activities were discussed.

The hostesses for the evening, Mrs. Dorothy Riggs, Mrs. Bessie Cooley and Mrs. Eleanor Catherman, served cake and coffee.
