George F. Jacobs

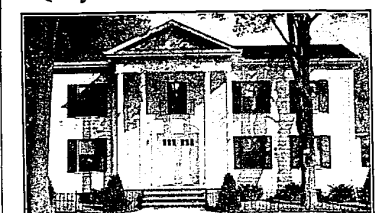
