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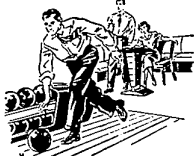
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RUNNING FOR EXERCISE OR PRESIDENT?

Air Show Features To Mark Navy Day

One of the largest demonstrations of Naval air power ever staged in this area will take place at Grosse Ile, Sunday, October 31, in celebration of Navy Day. It was announced today by Capt. James P. Walker, commanding officer of the base.

Some of the latest types of combat aircraft are being flown to Grosse Ile from the Atlantic Fleet for the demonstration, and Rear Admiral D. V. Gallery, assistant chief of Naval Operations for Guided Missiles, will be principal speaker. Governor Sigler will also deliver a Navy Day Message.

One of the highlights of the occasion will be the demonstration of the twin-jet fighter planes in a dazzling display of formation aerobatics, under the command of Lt. Col. Marion Carl, famous Marine ace who formerly held the world's speed record.

The program will also include an aerial show by the Naval Reserve pilots from Grosse Ile, simulated aircraft carrier operations performed from the runways of the base. Music for the occasion will be furnished by the Ford Motor Company's International Champion Scotch Kilt Band, the Great Lakes Steel Drum and Bugle Corps, the Ypsilanti All-Girl Drum and Bugle Corps and the high school bands from Wyandotte, Trenton, Melvindale and River Rouge.

The gates of the base will be open to the public at noon, but the demonstrations will not begin until 1:30 p.m. Besides the demonstrations of flying, the huge main hangar of the station will afford many displays of combat aircraft, guided missiles and training devices used by the Navy.

The committee on arrangements has made plans for good music, the awarding of a prize for the best costume appearing at the dance, and will serve refreshments.



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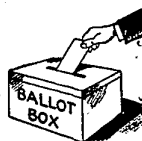


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
