

Lloyd Gullen Dies At 81

FARMINGTON A member of a longtime Farmington family, Lloyd S. Gullen, 81, was laid to rest Wednesday in Oakwood Cemetery.

Final services were conducted by his nephew, George E. Gullen, president of Wayne State University, whose father, the late Rev. George E. Gullen, was a pastor in the area for more than 50 years. He is a member of the First Congregational Church of Farmington.

Mr. Gullen, who lived in Farmington 40 years before retiring to Florida three years ago, died Feb. 24 after a week's illness. The body was returned to Thayer Funeral Home here from Florida.

A native of Brantford, Ont., Mr. Gullen was a school teacher in Northern Michigan and engaged in the real estate business in Farmington. During World War II, he took over operation of the Civic Theater while the manager was away in service.

He was a life member of Farmington Masonic Lodge No. 151, F&M; a 40-year member of the Farmington Exchange Club, and a member of the Detroit Board of Realtors.

Survivors are his wife, Viola; three daughters, Bethel Adams of Farmington, Brenda Barker of Clearwater, Fla., and Jean Anderson of California; a son, Dr. Robert Gullen of Arizona; a sister, Mrs. Irene Wallis of Livonia; 15 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren.

Gift Tree Is Donated To Farmington Library

FARMINGTON A hand-sculptured, six-foot, copper elm tree soon will adorn the adult reading room of Farmington Library on 12 Mile Road, another gift of the Farmington Friends of the Library.

Announcement of the gift was made at the group's board meeting by Mrs. William Mathews, retiring president, and Mrs. Mary Mitchell, head librarian.

Mrs. Mathews described the tree as "exquisite in detail, with small fragile leaves."

The outgoing president also reported purchase of a Polaroid camera and an instamatic camera and light to be used to record visually the many activities at the libraries.

The board approved unanimously establishment of a \$100 revolving fund to provide refreshments for children's programs.

About 250 persons now are members of the Farmington Friends of the Library which helps provide "extras" that tax dollars cannot purchase. Friends hope the next gift will be a cassette copier, so that original cassettes may be kept in the library and a

copy made for a borrower to take home and erased on return.

Approximately 33,000 persons are registered users who enjoy and appreciate the contributions of the Friends to the two libraries.

Invitations to become member of the Friends now are available at both libraries, and thought is being given to placing them at check-out desks for the convenience of library users who would like to join.
