

Reconstructionist Leader To Speak

Alan W. Miller, a leading spokesman for the reconstructionist movement in Judaism, will be the guest lecturer at the editorial board of the Reconstructionist Institute in Detroit, Tuesday, March 6. He will speak in the social hall of the synagogue, 29901 Middlebelt, Farmington.

The lectures are moderated by Rabbi Jacob Segal and are followed by a social hour.

The reconstructionist movement was founded in the 1930s by Mordecai M. Kaplan. It is a philosophy which seeks to reinterpret key aspects of Jewish belief so that they are more in line with the modern temper. G-d is seen by the reconstructionist not as a personal being, but rather "the sum total of all the forces that make for salvation."

Rabbi Miller is currently the spiritual leader of the Society for the Advancement of Judaism, founded by Kaplan.

He also serves on the editorial board of the Reconstructionist Magazine, and is visiting lecturer at the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College in Philadelphia.

A COMMUNITY Sunday school class in the Redford area during the 1920 began the Drummonds' ministry.

They had recently been married and were members of the Military Avenue United Presbyterian Church of Detroit. Rev. Drummond then was working as a tool grinder.

Three years later, in 1938, Covenant Community Church was organized as an independent congregation and Rev. Drummond was called as its first pastor.

The church grew and his responsibilities increased, and in 1942 he resigned his job at Detroit Timken Axle to devote full time to the church.
