Record Vote Cast In Township, City Is Under 1944 Total

Although both the Township and City of Farmington showed large majorities for the Republican candidates, an unexpectedly high Democratic vote was cast in the Tuesday election...

A high percentage of the registered voters in both the City and Township went to the polls. The highest vote ever cast was recorded in Farmington Township...

Beginning early in the morning, voters started streaming into the polling booths, and kept it up during the rest of the day...

Comment heard in the line up of voters was that the majority knew how they wanted to vote. As in the past, Farmington voters, particularly those in the City and in Precinct One, gave a good majority to Republican candidates...

By noon on Tuesday, 315 electors had voted in the City of Farmington out of a total of nearly 300 registrations. At Precinct No. One in the Township, almost 500 voters had cast their ballots by noon...

In all three precincts, the ratio of voters was approximately one-third completed by noon time. Except for a heavy afternoon vote, this meant that the greater majority of voters were cast in the evening hours after 5:00 p.m. when the polls were rushed until the last minute...
