Local Women Exhibit At Hotel Tuller Show

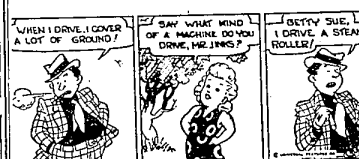
