## New Car To Be Shown At Novi

Trickey's Hunting and Fishing Supply store, at 43220 Grand River, in Novi, will soon be the mecca for all persons desiring to see the latest development in automotive passenger cars. The showing of a new car at that location will be held during the last ten days of November.

The latest development is the "Playboy," the newest arrival in the expanding field of passenger cars.

The "Playboy" is larger in size than the passenger cars in the small car class, and still smaller than the usual type of car. It is something distinctly different because it is the first of its kind. The newcomer is a distinctive design, combining the features of a business coupe, club coupe and convertible coupe. Only the one type is available, but the car's all metal top makes it an all-weather car. It has a wheel base of 90 inches, and overall length of 155 inches. It stands 56 inches high. Its single seat width is 50 inches, with ample space of 25 cubic feet in back of the seat (with top up) and an additional 13 cubic feet of space in the luggage compartment.

The "Playboy" is powered with a Leyland-L-type engine with a 48 horse-power engine. Its oil capacity is four quarts, and its radiator capacity is only 10 quarts. The manufacturers claim that the "Playboy" will travel 65 miles an hour or over, while tests have shown the car will achieve 25 miles or more per gallon of fuel.

A trans-continental test-run of the "Playboy" was made last April, in which the small car traversed the country from New York City to Los Angeles in 62 hours and 20 minutes—almost equalling the fastest train time.
