State Duck Season Proves A Success

Timing the opening of Michigan's duck season with the migration of the birds this year proved successful, judging from the conservation department's final wildfowl report. The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the federal controlling agency, allows the department some latitude in choosing dates.

The simultaneous opening of the waterfowl and small game season proved satisfactory from a management standpoint. Herb Miller, department duck specialist, advised that hunters seemed pleased with the joint season opening since it lessened hunting pressure both in the marshes and on farmland. Their surveys indicate that the average success of the duck hunter was better than last year.

Frozen Onions

Some people believe that onions are poisonous after they have been frozen. This is not true. In fact, onions which have been frozen may even be used successfully if they are thawed out slowly. But they will not keep long after being frozen, says the state of North Carolina extensionist.

State Restricts All Prospecting

The common belief that a prospector can search anywhere and, assuming a strike is made, stake out a claim which would give him ownership to the minerals and ores discovered does not hold true in Michigan. This is possible in many parts of the country, the conservation department's lands division advises, but Michigan land laws do not provide for this procedure.

The land in Michigan is either owned by private interests, the state, or the federal government. A prospector working privately-owned land is a trespasser unless he has first made arrangements with the property owner. To be safe, the prospector should have a written agreement with the owner stating how the potential fruits of his labor shall be shared. Failure to take this precaution may result in the prospector receiving nothing for his work.

A lease must be obtained, in advance, in order to prospect on state land. Leases are offered at public auction and must be approved by the conservation commission. The information can be secured by writing the lands division of the conservation department at Lansing.

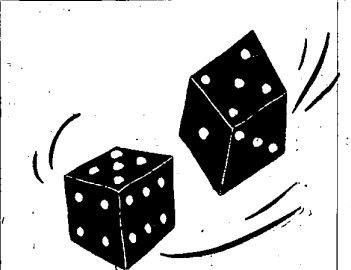
