Existing hospitals to be expanded, are: Children's, \$750,000; Cottage, \$750,000; Detroit Osteopathic, \$200,000; Florence Crittenton, \$200,000; Grace Northwestern, \$1,250,000; Harper, \$500,000; Mt. Carmel Mercy, \$1,000,000; Providence, \$350,000; St. Joseph Mercy (Pontiac), \$550,000; and Woman's, \$1,500,000.
