## Medals Shown During Exhibit

A special medal of honor exhibit is displayed at the Livonia Mall, Seven Mile and Middle Belt, through March 10. It is sponsored by Livonia VFW command post 941.

The names of more than 3,200 American war heroes from the Civil War through the Vietnam conflict are included in the display. Names are arranged in alphabetical order by conflict and include the name, rank, service and home state of each winner.

The medal has been presented during 16 conflicts. Eight awards were also made by special act of Congress to military men for extraordinary accomplishments during peacetime, including Charles Lindbergh, and to the unknown soldiers of World War I and II and Korean War.

Air Force personnel will be present to answer questions.

# Trust Fund Picks Officers

BIRMINGHAM — New officers for the Oakland County Community Trust have been elected for 1973.

They are: Marlin R. Hemphill of Troy, re-elected chairman; Julius Pochelon of Birmingham, vice chairman; and Brian Hisky of Farmington, re-elected secretary.

DURING the past six years, the trust has distributed more than 100 grants.

It was founded in 1964 by the Oakland County Medical Society from a surplus of money contributed to the countywide anti-polio immunization drive.

Because of this, the agency was dubbed "sugar cube trust" by its organizers. The funds allocated by the agency have been used for education scholarships, research in science, and enriching programs that benefit those living in Oakland County.

THE TRUST started with a little more than \$200,000 in 1966 and has since raised \$285,000 and distributed 108 grants totaling \$45,781.

Most of the grants,

averaging \$400 per year, are made as college scholarships to high school graduates in Oakland County.

Scholarships are annual awards based on scholastic ability and financial need.

To maintain the award, the recipient must keep a satisfactory grade level and rate of progress. The student's academic progress is reviewed each year by the scholarship committee.

The trust originally was established on the concept of giving for enduring good," says Hemphill. "The committee believes this principle has been most adequately accomplished, and the trust itself has increased."

GIFTS to the trust are welcome, says Hemphill, and may be sent in care of the Detroit Bank & Trust, Detroit.
