Spartans, Rocks Collide Tonight In Tourney Test

Livonia Stevenson wanted up for its tournament test tonight against Plymouth with a 66-59 victory over Pontiac Northern to finish Inter-Lakes league competition at 5-3 and 12-8 for the full schedule.

The Spartans thus paved the way for Walled Lake Central to take undisputed possession of the Inter-Lakes title with a 7-4 mark, Northern falling to second at 6-2. Stevenson's 5-3 was good for third.

Although Stevenson shot into a 36-27 halftime lead over the Spartans, the Pontiac club rallied for 20 points in the third stanza to edge ahead, 47-46.

Stevenson converted 12 of 17 free throws in the final period to pull ahead again and in Dale Haberman had the game's leading scorer with 25 points. Haberman popped in nine field goals and made good on seven of eight free throw attempts.

Carlington Saves Title For Glenn

Dave Carlington, who has been leading Westland John Glenn's basketball attack all winter, saved his three most important points until the last five seconds of the regular season.

Because of that basket and succeeding free throw by the 6-4 Glenn senior, the Rockets pulled a 56-55 victory over Livonia's Franklin out of the fire. With it came Glenn's first Northwest Suburban league title. Finishing 9-1 to second-place Franklin's 7-3.

This was a barn-burner all the way as the score was knotted eight times. Franklin's Patriots led at the quarter, 15-14, yielded to Glenn at half-time, 32-28; and then came back to take a 44-42 lead after three periods.

With 21 seconds remaining, Franklin's Jim Knapp canned two free throws for a 55-53 lead as the Patriots fought for at least a share of the crown they won outright last year, when Glenn finished as runner-up.

The Rockets earmarked the last shot for Carlington, who has been averaging a fraction better than 20 points per game, and his driving layup made it 55-all. Fouled in the process, Carlington then hit the cords for the winning free throw, putting his point production for the night at 29.

Carlington also starred on the boards as he picked off 13 rebounds to aid Glenn in posting a 34-22 margin in that department.

Tim Fischer led Franklin scorers with 20 points, but as a team the Patriots were outshot from the floor, 24 goals to 17.

19. Their strength at the free throw line, where they collected 17 points to Glenn's eight, helped keep the Patriots in the hunt.

An important key in Glenn's successful title bid was the defensive play of Jeff Brittain, who stopped Franklin's Kevin Kaseta without a field goal. Boasting an average of 18 points per game, Kasela was forced to settle for just five points, all on free throws.

The triumph was Glenn's sixth in a row and boosted the Rockets' record for the regular season to 15-3. For Franklin the defeat cut the season's won-lost mark to 12-8.

North Farmington nailed down third place in the final Northwest Suburban standings with a 60-58 victory over Garden City East.

The win put the Raiders at 5-5 in the league behind John Glenn and Franklin, with East settling for a 3-7 loop mark and fifth place. For the
