Schools And Counties Get Benefit Of State Tax

Counties, townships and school districts will benefit this year to the extent of \$417,751 from a ten cents an acre tax paid by the state on land it owns within these areas. The tax levy on state-owned acreage is prorated back to the county treasurers on the basis of tax equities each unit held when the property reverted to state ownership. County treasurers, in turn, will prorate the money back to local townships and school districts according to amount of acreage involved and amount of taxes levied to townships and school districts during the preceding year.

Precautions for Using 2,4-D

Nearly all plants commonly grown in vegetable and flower gardens are sensitive to 2,4-D. Even a trifling and invisible drift of spray or dust across a property line can be the cause of widespread killing of someone's favorite flowers. Including expensive perennials which are difficult to replace. Damage can be done unintentionally with 2,4-D by using the same sprayer apparatus for other types of spraying. If it is at all possible, to avoid damage, sprayers used for 2,4-D should never be used for spraying any other material. If this is not practical, special care should be taken to clean the sprayer thoroughly of 2,4-D.

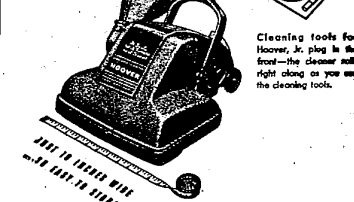
