STATE SEEKS LAKE NAME CHANGES TO END DUPLICATION

Renaming of Michigan lakes, rivers and streams is in accord with conservation department policy where confusion and duplication can be eliminated.

Persons or groups who believe they have legitimate reasons for requesting official name changes should direct their inquiries to the state committee on geographic names, with the conservation department at Lansing. Part of the formality of name changing includes getting the approval of the local county board of supervisors.

Resolving of over 100 geographic features of the Manistee national forest has been completed.

The name suggested should be appropriate but not too long. The name of a living person is never used nor is a name composed of a series of hyphenated words. Those proposed changes which are eventually approved will be inserted on all future maps on which place and feature names have official standing.

Indicative of the duplication which still exists is illustrated in Lake country. This western Michigan county had five Perch, three Bullhead, three Big Mud and two Bluegill lakes. The adjacent Mason county possessed four Long and four Mud lakes.

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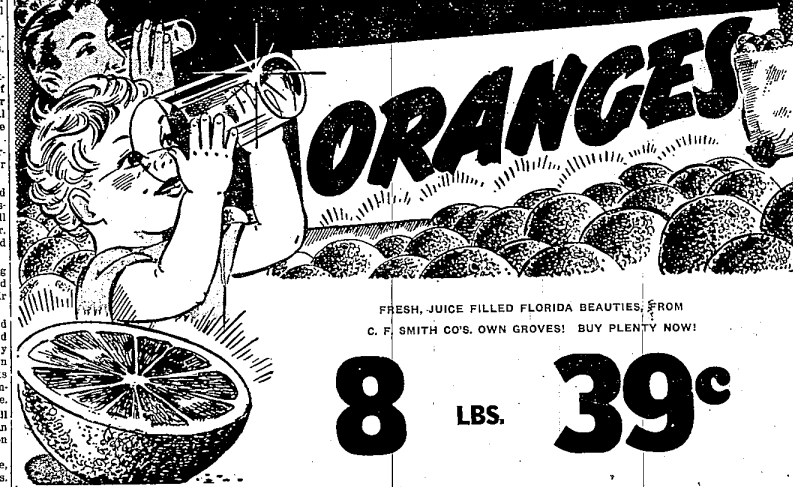
