## COUNTY FRUIT MEN HOLD FIRST GROUP MARKETING CLINIC

A marketing clinic to develop a consumer education program for the greater use of fruits and vegetables was held Wednesday night at the Bloomfield Town Hall by the Fruit Growers Extension Planning committee of the Oakland County Extension Service. The meeting was held with the cooperation of the Michigan State College Agricultural Economics Service and the Oakland County Retail Food Dealers Association.  
Paul Button, director of the Southeastern Fruit Growers Society, acted as chairman, and introduced various speakers.  
Topics and speakers for the evening were Wendell Green, fruit grower, of Walled Lake, who spoke "Grower Brands", Stanley Proctor, fruit grower, of South Lyon, who talked on "Can We Determine Season Prices?", Gene Pini, grocer and fruit grower, who spoke on "How Should Grocers Merchandise Fruits?", and Albert Esslinger, fruit grower, of Birmingham, whose topic was "Getting Buyers and Sellers Together".

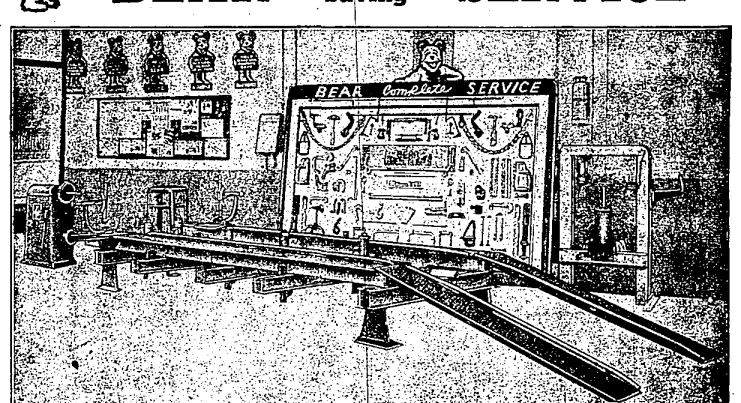
