Why Is Cinderella Of the Dairy Industry

Cheese why is the Cinderella of the dairy industry. For long centuries this by-product of cheese making was valued but little. More often than not it was only a nuisance and presented a disposal problem to these factories.

Today, why or why products have found many important uses in the food industry, in pharmaceutical laboratories and hospitals, in the confectioner's shop and the candy maker's kitchen. Amino acids obtained from whey helped save the lives of thousands of starving and undernourished people at the close of the war. And millions of pounds of dried cheese whey are mixed in poultry mashers each year to help make chicks grow faster and hens lay more eggs.

All of this has come about as a result of scientific research which has disclosed that whey contains some very important nutrients.

When cheese is made, milk fat and casein are removed from whole milk and liquid whey remains. It's about 84 per cent water. Perhaps that's why realization of the true value of its nutrients came slowly. But when commercially dried whey from cheddar cheese contains only 3.7 per cent moisture and is a concentration of a number of important milk nutrients, including lactose (milk sugar) proteins, milk minerals and water soluble vitamins.

Plant Poisoning of Animals
Over three dozen different plants are capable of poisoning farm animals. Since livestock usually can't distinguish safe plants from harmful ones, watchfulness on the part of owners is essential. Arrow grass, cocklebur shoots, water hemlock, larkspur and loco weed are just a few of the many plants that cause huge losses to the livestock industry. Suspect plant poisoning whenever an apparently healthy animal develops convulsions, breathes fast and falls to the ground. At the first sign of trouble the entire herd should be moved to another pasture or lot and a diagnosis obtained without delay to determine the exact cause of the trouble. Once the cause is known, steps can be taken to protect the rest of the herd.

Red Squill, Good Poison
Poison which the farmer most commonly uses to make good rats out of bad rats is Red Squill, recommended by the department of agriculture because it is effective, cheap and harmless to domestic animals. When dogs and cats eat it they throw it up, for it is an emetic. Chickens, too, can eat it with impunity, but when a rat gets it into his system it is pay day. At the outbreak of World War II the supply of squill, which comes from Mediterranean countries, was suddenly cut off. Squill is an extract from a bulb grown chiefly in Italy.

SPECIAL CANCER COURSE AT U. OF M. PROVES POPULAR

Twice as many applicants as could be accepted were received from Michigan doctors for a four-day course at University of Michigan Hospital in the simpler procedures of cancer detection.

Twenty-four of the applicants were accepted for the course, scheduled from January 25 through 28. Dr. Howard H. Cummings, chairman of the Department of Postgraduate Medicine, said there is a reasonable possibility that the course will be repeated after the first class and the faculty have had a chance to evaluate it.

"We hope this new course will grow and its usefulness be extended by bringing the latest diagnostic tests to all the people of Michigan," Dr. Cummings added. "Because the simple methods of diagnosis will be taught, we hope to do away with the time lag in finding most of the common cancers."

The course includes both lectures and clinic sessions, with actual patients being observed. The doctors will study proper methods of examining patients, observing their symptoms, the appearance of lesions, and the best methods of obtaining bits of suspected tissue for microscopic examination.

Pathology classes will include practical work in evaluating the degree of malignancy shown by the tissues and work with the microscope.

Soil's "Fuel Tank" Needs Organic Matter, Farmers Are Advised

CHICAGO—Your soil burns up organic matter in producing crops, the same as your car uses up gasoline to keep running, declared the Middle West Soil Improvement Committee in a statement issued here.

And unless you refill the soil's organic matter "fuel tank," your soil will run out of gas, the statement says. That means low crop yields per acre, high production costs and smaller income.

"Organic matter is burned up through rapid decomposition in smothering crop growth," declares the statement. "No soil has an inexhaustible supply of organic matter. It can be easily drained off by poor management. Too many corn crops in succession will mine out the organic matter on even the best heavy clay and loam soils.

When your soil loses its organic matter, it loses its ability to produce high yields. The removal of moisture-holding organic matter breaks down soil structure. "The secret of balancing output and input of organic matter lies in good soil management. That means a rotation buttressed by deep-plowed legumes. You can't get a good stand of legumes with husky roots simply by seeding sweet clover or alfalfa. You have to have the soil if tests indicate the need. You have to add plenty of fertilizer carrying phosphate and potash. Then you will get good growth and the legumes will do their job of repairing soil damage."

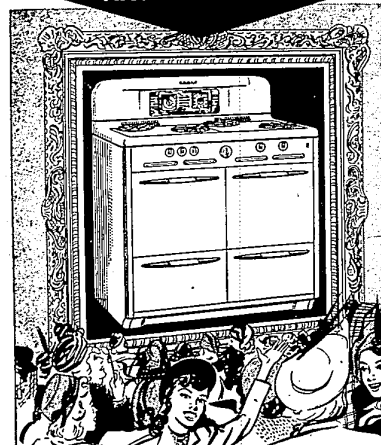
